

SKELETONS IN THE CLOSET



I Cor. 6:9-11 “Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind, ...”

Meaning: A secret source of shame, potentially ruinous if exposed, which a person or family makes effort to conceal.

The phrase, “a skeleton in the closet” was coined in England in the 19th century.

The phrase was first used in the early 1800’s.

It has been suggested that the phrase derives from the era of the notorious body snatchers, that is, prior to 1832, in the UK.

It refers to the grim evidence of a murder.

We know that the blood of Jesus washes us white as snow.

Isaiah 1:18 “Come now, & let us reason together, saith the Lord: though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool.”
