

THE JOURNEY CONTINUES

This week following our training sessions has been full of adventure and opportunities for God to move. Last Saturday, we traveled to Fajardo to help the local church evangelize for their Sunday service. I was able to use my Spanish as we invited people in the neighborhood surrounding the church. There were at least 4 people who came to service because of the invitations!



We left our apartment in Loiza last Monday and moved to Ponce, which is in the south central part of the island. It was a couple hours drive, so we left the rest of the day to settle in and buy the groceries that we needed. Last Tuesday, we began evangelizing in the city of Lajas in preparation for the "Noches de Fuego" services. Pastor Lopez has a small church with a surrounding neighborhood that needs to be reached. After hurricane Maria, many families relocated to the continental US. There has caused a decline in the amount of children in the churches of Puerto Rico, so a large focus of our evangelism in Lajas was reaching the children! Services were held in a covered, open air basketball court.



There was at least one family that came as a result of our outreach efforts, there were multiple neighborhood kids, and at least one person received the Holy Ghost! It has been amazing being able to bond with the people in Puerto Rico and to see their love for people and passion for God. Working and worshiping alongside them has brought so much joy and has been so rewarding.



Yesterday we split up into two groups for the morning service to go to two different churches. My group stayed in Ponce where I was able to lead worship and testify. Then, we all drove about 2 hours away to go to a small church in Aguadilla. The only members there right now are the Pastor, a new member, and a small family. God moved in a mighty way and we are believing Him for revival in this church!
